



Thank you for Accepting an AFS Student!

Consider these next steps before your student arrives:

SHARE

Share the AFS student's profile and Placement Acceptance Form (PAF) with appropriate school staff. This information contains **transcripts, test scores, health information, and contact information** for both the host family and local AFS volunteer.

REVIEW

Review the student's AFS Health Certificate early, ideally before arrival, **and contact AFS about any missing immunizations**. It is much easier and less disruptive to the adjustment process for students to receive necessary vaccinations in their home country and before the first day of school.

INFORM

Inform **the host family of your enrollment procedures**. Is there an online process? What paperwork do they need? Who do they contact? Completing as much of this process as possible before the student arrives saves everyone time and energy to focus on welcoming the student.

REMEMBER

Remember that AFS expects students to follow all school rules and policies including those on attendance, extracurricular participation, and academic integrity. **AFS does NOT require students to enroll in a particular grade level, take specific courses, or receive academic credit or a diploma.**

EXPLORE

Explore our AFS **intercultural resources**. These are great for teachers who will have an exchange student in their classroom for the first time or for educators who want to expand on the global perspectives brought by the exchange students in any subject. These are a great way to build a sense of belonging in every classroom.

CONTACT

Contact **your local AFS Volunteer** if you have any questions or concerns before or after the student arrives. They will also be reaching out to you regularly to check in and share opportunities and resources! We value your partnership and are here to support you throughout your hosting experience.


Classroom Activities & Intercultural Resources
