Passing the Baton from Placement to Support (Linne/Leigh)

Host families may feel
"abandoned" by hosting
volunteers once they transition
to Support

Matching Liaisons/Placements (Linda)

- An important (and sometimes fun) activity for the hosting placement and support teams to collaborate around is matching placements with Liaisons
- Important to consider:
 - Potentially challenging participant characteristics
 - New vs. Experienced host families and liaisons
 - o Center of core hosting area vs. outlying area



Collaboration Between Hosting and Support Volunteers (Ian)

- Host Family Interviews (What to look out for)
- Host Family / Student pairing when the need for a move occurs
- Hosting vols able to plug benefits of support to host fams when recruiting/identifying host fams
- Communication between hosting vols and support vols integral to overall team health



Encouraging Conversation (Traci)


- Pre-Screen families ask liaisons to sign up, making sure there are backups
- Host family orientations making sure conversations are happening with support
- Plans for recruiting host families, including talking points, shared with support volunteers
 - Collaboration and conversation between hosting/support volunteers

How hosting interfaces with support

- 1. Making sure a placement is supportable
- 2. How to avoid unsupportable placements
